As a reminder, the administration of your respective Squadrons is very important. We are responsible to complete all of the reports required of us at various times of the year, in our case, mostly done annually. Now is the time to make sure that you are recording your activities so you can file accurate year end reports. Please pay attention to the deadlines on our reports it is important. We will talk more about reporting later in the year, but want to get the conversation started now.

As we are getting closer to the holidays, I want to take the time to wish you and your families a Happy Thanksgiving.

Greetings Detachment of Florida Membership Team,

With Fall Conference just completed, we have work to do. Our October 24th, 2019 membership report had the Detachment at 32.273% with our 35% target November 11th, 2019. Our renewal rate for the Detachment is 23.93%. We still have many ZERO Squadrons that need the attention of the District Officers and membership teams.

Other issues that I am going to be watching closely are Squadrons that reach 100% and have no other reported membership for the balance of the year. We must recruit new members into ALL Squadrons if we are to grow and you guys are the best at recruiting. I know everyone is working hard on membership and Commander Klinger and I do thank you for that.

Our last report really did not look good as far as numbers. While I'm not real sure what happened, I am checking with Department to see if we are having an issue at Headquarters. I do know that some changes have taken place since Irene Graham has retired. I will be investigating the issues as I have had many communications regarding Squadrons that stated that they had transmitted membership. More to come on the issue.

The Detachment target numbers are displayed on this page. You can see that the next three targets are close together and we will have a membership increase of 25% in those three target dates (November, December, & January). During this time, we also have our Holiday season. What I am getting to, is we need to be really staying on top of membership as this time will fly by.

Working membership this year has been very interesting with the passing of the Legion Act and some changes that are being done at the National level. Those of you who attended Fall Conference have heard about some of these changes. We'll make any further changes known as they become available.

None of the things the Legion has passed influences us until "WE" vote on and except a resolution for that change or changes. Everyone will be informed when the time comes, and we have gotten our information from National. Until that time comes, it is business as usual without the unnecessary conversations and statements.

The Member Training & Development Committee needs your help: WE NEED INSTRUCTORS. Please provide me a resume of your instruction capabilities. We must get this done and it needs to happen now. We only have 3-4 instructors and we need your help. If you have the background or think you are interested, please get your resume to me and I will pass the information on to Chairman Roberts.



Constitution and By-Laws, Ed Sheubrooks, Chairman

With the Legion Act, there are a lot of changes that have happened, and will continue to happen. Of course the most important one is the changing of the Eligibility dates for The American Legion. When this was signed into Law by President Trump, it not only changed the Eligibility Dates for The Legion, but as a PRO-GRAM of The American Legion, it also changed the date for the Sons as well. This was voted on and approved at the past National Convention.

Now let's address the change to The Preamble of The American Legion. At the Fall National Executive Committee meeting, The American Legion voted to change the wording of their Constitution. This was done with a Resolution that was passed by the Legion NEC. This change does not yet reflect a change in the wording of the Sons Preamble. We need a Resolution to be passed by our NEC. This should be done at the Spring NEC meeting in May.

I know everyone has had a lot of questions on these issues. We must follow proper protocol and procedure in order to make sure we are proceeding correctly. There will be discussions on these and other topics at the Fall Conference.

Endorsements for Office



It is the policy of the Detachment of Florida that no endorsement be posted prior to the Annual Fall Conference. The Detachment of Florida provides this information for the benefit of our membership. The addition of endorsement information does not indicate support for an individual candidate by the Detachment of Florida.

In order for an endorsement to be posted to the Detachment Newsletter "The Source" or the Detachment Website, an endorsement letter must meet the following requirements.

- 1. Each endorsement letter must come from a Florida Squadron or Post and must be signed by the Squadron Commander and Squadron Adjutant, or the Post Commander and Post Adjutant or any combination of these.
 - a. The letter must be on Squadron or Post letterhead and include the date that the Squadron or Post made the endorsement and that the membership approved said endorsement.
 - b. This letter should contain information explaining why the individual should be considered for the office he is seeking and a narrative of positions held to show his leadership potential.
- 2. Endorsements will only be accepted for the elected Detachment Officers, District Commanders as follows:
 - a. Detachment Commander, Detachment Vice Commanders, National Executive Committeeman, National Executive Committeeman Alternate, Detachment Historian, Detachment Chaplain, Detachment Sergeant-At-Arms and the District Commanders

Endorsement letters must be submitted, in writing, to the Detachment Adjutant as follows with the required signatures (in the format listed above).

- 1. Endorsement letters can be sent via the US Postal Service to the Detachment Adjutant Jim Roberts 2691 Mount Pleasant Rd, Quincy, FL 32352.
- Endorsement letters can be scanned and sent by e-mail to the Detachment at floridasons@legionmail.org. Scanned documents are required to be in an Adobe Portable Document Format (.pdf) and must have all of the original signatures as required and be of good quality.


