Greeting Membership Team,

We are fast approaching our midway point in membership and we have made our first four targets. As of this report we have unofficially made our 60% target. Our December 19th, 2019 membership report had the Detachment at 60.45% with our 60% target date January 15th, 2020. Our renewal rate for the Detachment is 45.07%. We still have 13 ZERO Squadrons that need the attention of the District Officers and membership teams. Other issues that I am going to be watching closely are Squadrons that reach 100% and report no other membership for the balance of the year. We must recruit new members into ALL Squadrons if we are to grow and you guys are the best at recruiting. We have had some issues with numbers with the change to the transmittal portal, but I believe we are on the right track now. It does help with report and will in time make it much easier to get your membership done.

Working membership this year has been very interesting with the passing of the Legion Act and some changes that are being done at the National level. We will communicate these changes as we are made aware.

With the passing of the "LEGION ACT" there have been lots of verbiage changes within The American Legion. With these changes The Sons of The American Legion will also have lots of changes to be made to our manuals, membership applications, membership eligibility requirements, requirements of Detachment Officers, Committee/Commission members just to name a few. Lots of stuff has been discussed without the correct information to pass on to our membership. This has got to stop! Many, if not all of these changes may require a resolution to be put into effect; some others may be administrative changes. Resolutions must be brought to the floor of the Fall Conference or our annual Convention. None of the things the Legion have passed influences us until "WE" vote on and accept a resolution for that change or changes. Everyone will be informed when the time comes, and we have gotten our information from National. Until that time comes, it is business as usual without the unnecessary conversations and statements.

As we mentioned during the Fall Conference we are now able to process membership through the MySAL Web Portal. This information and instructions on how to process membership using the portal has been distributed and needs to reach all Squadrons. Please review the information and understand how this is to work. If your Squadron is not using MySAL, you need to request access. Access to the portal is granted after verification of information provided; if you have not submitted a Squadron Officer's Report form, you will not be able to access the portal. Officer's Report forms are available on the website and should be sent to the Detachment Adjutant.

The Member Training & Development Committee needs additional instructors. WE NEED INSTRUCTORS. Please provide Jim Roberts (Chairman) or John Jennings (Vice Chairman) a resume of your interest and of your instruction experience. We must get this done and it needs to happen very soon if we are going to provide training to our membership.

Endorsements for Office



It is the policy of the Detachment of Florida that no endorsement be posted prior to the Annual Fall Conference. The Detachment of Florida provides this information for the benefit of our membership. The addition of endorsement information does not indicate support for an individual candidate by the Detachment of Florida.

In order for an endorsement to be posted to the Detachment Newsletter "The Source" or the Detachment Website, an endorsement letter must meet the following requirements.

1. Each endorsement letter must come from a Florida Squadron or Post and must be signed by the Squadron Commander and Squadron Adjutant, or the Post Commander and Post Adjutant or any combination of these.
 - a. The letter must be on Squadron or Post letterhead and include the date that the Squadron or Post made the endorsement and that the membership approved said endorsement.
 - b. This letter should contain information explaining why the individual should be considered for the office he is seeking and a narrative of positions held to show his leadership potential.
2. Endorsements will only be accepted for the elected Detachment Officers, District Commanders as follows:
 - a. Detachment Commander, Detachment Vice Commanders, National Executive Committeeman, National Executive Committeeman Alternate, Detachment Historian, Detachment Chaplain, Detachment Sergeant-At-Arms and the District Commanders

Endorsement letters must be submitted, in writing, to the Detachment Adjutant as follows with the required signatures (in the format listed above).

1. Endorsement letters can be sent via the US Postal Service to the Detachment Adjutant Jim Roberts – 2691 Mount Pleasant Rd, Quincy, FL 32352.
2. Endorsement letters can be scanned and sent by e-mail to the Detachment at floridasons@legionmail.org. Scanned documents are required to be in an Adobe Portable Document Format (.pdf) and must have all of the original signatures as required and be of good quality.



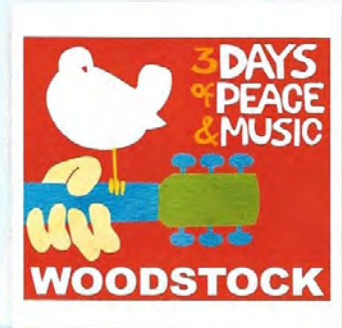
