jutant's Tom Soeder and George Aichele have been tasked to contact the Detachment Officers and Chairmen to have them submit Articles each month for "The Source". With the start of our 2020-021 membership campaign our first target of 10% is on September 3rd, 2020. Congratulations on hitting this first target! The following list contains issues I believe we are facing and will continue to face into the future. It may not be exhaustive, but these are items we must work at to be successful. Now is the time to get these changes made so we're not surprised when it happens.

- Improve communications with our Squadrons and their membership.
 - Squadrons need to develop a communication line to their members with both phone numbers and email contacts.
 - Explain to your membership the need for this information.
 - Explain to your membership the importance and value of using our website (floridasons.org).
- Improve communication to our Squadrons.
 - The Detachment should have a valid email address for each of the Squadron Officers.
- Improve communication within the Detachment of Florida.
- Improve communication with Commission/Committee Chairman.
 - Commission/Committee Chairman need to involve the members.
 - Regular communication should be held within the Commission/Committees as to what is going on and get them involved.
 - Promote involvement to all members.
- Improve and expand MT&D training.
 - Improve the education of our Officers, our Chairman, and most importantly our members.
- Improve the use of MySAL by our Squadrons.
 - Gain access to the applications that are online. It must be approved by your Post Officers.
 - To use the MySAL membership portal it is imperative that your Squadron Officer report
 forms are completed properly and indicate the proper person for processing. If this form
 is not on file with the National organization, you cannot get access to MySAL. This is a
 must. Let me repeat that you must complete and transmit the completed Squadron Offic-

ers report form to get your temporary log-in information. The Squadron Adjutant will be verified with Department before access is given by National.

- · Improve Squadron reporting.
- Forms are available on our <u>website</u> under the administration tab. They are fillable, you can save them, and you are able to print them.

This just a snapshot of just some of the identified needs that I, as your Internal Affairs Chairman, have identified for improvements for our Detachment.

I will publish this with every Internal Affairs article I submit. Please read and memorize our preamble to our Constitution. Read each line and stop for just a minute and reflect on the words.
