

Alrighty Now....It's official, PDC Tom Klinger and I were sworn in as your Florida SAL National Executive Committeeman and Alternate for 2021-2022 by National Commander Michael Fox. We thank all of you for your support and we look forward to representing you with the National organization.

Attending The Sons of The American Legion National Convention in Phoenix, AZ. and even after 12 years leaves me awestruck and proud of our Detachment and Organization. When the National Convention is so far away our delegate numbers are smaller but as always your Florida SAL Delegation is always strong and looking sharp dressed in our coats and ties.

The National Convention opened early on Friday morning August 27th with all the Convention Committee meetings to conclude their business from the year 2020-2021. This year was unusual without JJ in attendance. I was prepared to represent the Detachment with voice and vote at the Pre-National Executive Committee Meeting immediately before the opening of the Convention. PDC Tom Klinger attended even though he would not be sworn in as ANEC till the Post NEC Meetings. He attended so as to have a better understanding of how things work. PNC Jim Roberts attended the meeting to complete the FL NEC delegation.

This was my last National Legislative & Rules Committee Meeting rolling off after my 3 + 1-year National appointment because of Covid. Our TAL National Legislative Committee is advising all SAL Members to contact their Congressman and Senators concerning House Bill 2372 and Senate Bill 952 The Presumptive Benefits for War Fighters Exposed to Burn Pits and Other Toxins Act of 2021. Tell them you are part of the Florida American Legion Family and you support Veterans and would like for them to support HR 2372 & S 952. If you need help contacting your FL Congressman and/or Senator go, to legion.org/legislative (Take Action)

The SAL National Convention was gaveled open by our 5 National Vice Commanders due to Commander Clint Bolt's absence because of Covid 19, promptly at 1 PM on Friday, August 27, 2021, in the Phoenix AZ. Convention Center. Florida's Delegation included PDC Tom Klinger Delegation Chairman, PNC Jim Roberts Delegation Secretary, Current Detachment Commander Brian Carter, ANEC Bill Kelly, Detachment Vice Commander Central Gerard Sambets, PDC Bernie Wildrick, and Dual Member Jesse Figueroa. This Sons of The American Legion National Convention was one of the 1st Conventions to be Live Streamed out to all our members. My apologies if that information did not reach you in time to watch. The Detachment of Florida was seated right upfront due to your outstanding showing of 102%+ in Membership and the category 5, Author D Houghton Membership Award for the Largest increase of a Detachment 12,000+. Thanks to all of you for your hard work in pushing us over 20,000.

The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation President, our own FL NEC Dennis Boland displayed and wore his FL SAL Squadron 323 cover. This was a great honor that one of our own Florida Legion Family Members presented The Detachment of Florida with the two highest CWA Awards. 1st The Udie Grant Award for the most contributions by the FL American Legion Family and The Garland Murphy CWF Award for the most money contributed to the Child Welfare Foundation by the Detachment of Florida.

The American Legion Children & Youth Committee presented Past Detachment Commander Klinger the outstanding Children and Youth Squadron Awards for the Southern Region and The National Children & Youth Squadron of the Year award both for Florida Squadron 117 in Palm Bay. Outstanding Job Squadron 117.

On day 2, Convention delegates presented all the Resolutions stemming from the Legion Act passed several years ago and approved by the Legion/SAL NEC. All changes to the Sons of The American Legion National Constitution must be approved by the National Convention to be finalized. The delegates also presented a Resolution that would allow National reimbursement to the NECs for the National Convention,

since they do have two meetings at Convention. This only affects the smaller Detachments without the resources to provide reimbursement

The next and final day of the convention the elections were held and Michael Fox (CA) was elected National Commander and Jason Roberts (GA) was elected by the Southern Region National Vice Commander.

The Post NEC Meeting occurs almost immediately after the installation of the National Commander and Vice Commanders to make all the appointments for the National Organization in the upcoming year. This is very similar to our Detachment Convention. I was proud to be appointed to one of only two Committees that an NEC may be appointed to. My National Committee appointment is to the National Sub-Committee on Resolutions. I will proudly represent The Detachment of Florida to the best of my ability.

At the NEC Meeting, while seated between PNC Jim Roberts and ANEC Tom Klinger. While under New Business, I asked National Commander Fox if we could make it a priority this year to solve the SAL portion of the MYLEGION.ORG problems and informed him that our Squadrons had not received a Squadron Membership Report since April. He wrote a note to himself at the podium and said he would personally look into this matter. We now have this matter in the minutes and on the official record.

The Sons of The American Legion 49th Annual National Convention concluded on Sunday, August 29, 2021. We thank the Arizona American Legion Family for their hospitality, we all made our way back home to Florida.

On Sunday, August 7th, while attending the American Legion District Meeting in District 5, I was awarded the Department of Florida's Mentor's Pin from Department Commander Jerry Brandt and was thanked for mentoring him. This program is meant to recognize and facilitate members of our Florida Legion Family to help them in the learning process about all of our American Legion Family programs and our organization by mentoring that individual, which segues nicely into the point that almost everyone of our SAL Officers and Chairman has a counterpart in the American Legion Department of Florida.

My counterpart is Dennis Boland who serves as the Department of Florida's National Executive Committeeman. You should know our counterpart and be working with them and assisting that Legionnaire Officer to better our SAL program by Scoring for Veterans by Tackling their Needs.

Let's all try to make contact with our FL Legion Counterpart by Fall Conference and find a Squadron Officer, or another SAL Member who thirsts for knowledge and help them quench their thirst for knowledge by mentoring them. Sometimes it's as easy as giving a Squadron Member a SAL Squadron Handbook.

National is working diligently on the MyLegion system. Below is a common issue they are working on:

Group access denied / My Groups tab not appearing / Posts or Squadrons not appearing

This is primarily caused when registering a new account with an e-mail address that does not match the e-mail address on the member record. Please use the e-mail address associated with your member account during registration so data and access permissions can be assigned correctly. Should you have any questions/problems with Mylegion please call 833-253-9995 Mylegion support.

To use the MyLEGION membership portal, it is imperative that your Squadron Office's report form is completed properly. It is also imperative that your Annual Squadron Data Report (SDR) is completed. If this form is not on file with the National organization, you cannot get access to MyLEGION. The Squadron Adjutant will be verified with Department before access is given by National.

Our Membership Committee, headed by John Jennings, will be working hard to meet all our membership targets moving through the year. Our first target date is September 2, 2021, which is 10%. The membership theme this year is "Scoring for Veterans by Tackling Their Needs". Commander Carters membership goal this year is 21,000 members. We are all members of the Membership Committee, we need to work membership, as I am sure you will.

The Membership Training and Development Committee, (MT&D), headed by George Aichele held a committee meeting on July 29, 2021, and are working on new classes for the Fall Conference. Commander Carter has suggested new classes that I'm sure you will find beneficial.




