What changes am I talking about? Well, for years we have had feedback from you, the Squadron members, that we need more training sessions at the Conference. We have made that happen this year. The Member, Training, and Development Committee have been busy working on classes to present at the Conference. The Classes will be held on Friday, November 5th starting at 1:00pm. There will be information presented on the MyLegion area as well. On Saturday afternoon, we will once again have the Question and Answer Session. This has been very popular in the past with many misconceptions cleared up.

We will be accepting donations for all of our Charities at the Conference. This includes Florida Special Olympics, The Child Welfare Foundation, Project Vet Relief, and Detachment Commander Carter's charity, Fisher House. The National Organization is still having issues with the conversion from MySAL to the new MyLegion program. They were able to send a final report out this week and the Detachment finished with 20,745 members. Great Job everyone! Now full steam ahead for the 2022 goal.

The Detachment Roster is still being worked on. I cannot believe that a Squadron is not willing to submit their Officer Report. This will not only affect what information you receive from the Detachment, it will also affect and preempt your Squadron's Adjutant from accessing the MyLegion.org program once it is complete. There is a check and balance system in place for access to this. First the Squadron submits the report to Department. Next the Squadron Adjutant requests permission from National to access the system. National then notifies Department for verification of the Squadron Adjutant. If this is not on file at Headquarters, then the request is denied. It's a simple form that can be filled out online or mailed to Department. It takes less than five minutes to complete. If you are unsure if your Squadron has submitted, contact Detachment Assistant Adjutant George Aichele and he can give you that answer. Email data bases are also being compiled from these reports to send the flow of information from the Detachment direct to the Squadron. Communication is the key to our Organization's success and it starts with the SQUADRON!

The answer on The Department of Florida website says it all, "SAL Reports are not available at this time". When we ask WHY? The American Legion National Headquarters Staff replies that, "we are working on the problem." At the SAL National Convention Post NEC, we addressed the National Commander and asked to make it a priority this year to address and solve the membership reporting problem. The National Executive Committee Meeting will be October 1st, 2nd, & 3rd in Indianapolis In. and I am hopeful we will have an answer on the membership reports.

The NEC looks to have a full plate of resolutions upcoming at the meetings. Resolutions which are a driving force behind the betterment of our organization will be considered by the NEC Committeeman. My new national committeeman assignment has me taking up where JJ left off on the resolutions subcommittee. We have had one conference call and have another scheduled the weekend before we go to Indianapolis October 1st thru the 3rd and have our meeting of record. A report will be given in the November The Source and at Fall Conference.

Scoring for Veterans by Tackling Their Need is not just our Membership Theme but something we as Sons of The American Legion we should be doing every day. While a lot of Posts are doing well, some Posts have suffered during the pandemic; see if your Post may need your Squadron's assistance by donating some money or time. Several years ago we disbanded the CMN committee and explained to everyone that if we donated directly to the All Children's Hospital in Tampa and Miami more would go to our hospitals. Consider donating to The American Legion Operation Comfort Warrior where 100% of your donation goes to the Warrior instead of Wounded Warrior where you're paying for their advertising. Our oldest foundation founded in 1925 was renamed The American Legion Veterans & Childrens Foundation. The Veterans part of this foundation is one of the most important American Legion services by paying for the training of the National, Department, and Post Service Officers. The trained Post Service Officers provide to all veterans assistance with their military service benefits and with Veteran Affairs Services and their G I Bill Benefits by providing needed help.

The Childrens part of the foundation assists Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA). This grant is awarded to minor children of Veterans or active duty military to meet the needs of shelter, food, utilities, or health expenses. Understand please we are not telling you one foundation is better than another but it is suggested

Some are reporting they are not able to sign in and are receiving an error (ERR_SSL_PROTOCOL_ERROR) when attempting to sign into MyLegion.org. This is currently being investigated by their team. If you are experiencing this error, please sign into your internet service provider's website or mobile app to "Allow Access" to log-in.personifygo.com. For further assistance, please contact your internet service provider.

Throughout the year, it is necessary for National to contact Squadrons regarding membership renewals, awards, and general communications. In addition, National receives daily requests for Post and Squadron information from members and potential new members or others who are looking for information about The American Legion at the local level. Maintaining your Squadron's current information with National Headquarters has become more important than ever. It is also imperative that your Annual Squadron Data Report (SDR) is completed. If this form is not on file with the National organization, you cannot get access to MyLegion. The Squadron Adjutant will be verified with Department before access is given by National. The Annual Squadron Data Report must be forwarded to your Detachment & National Headquarters




