This month's article combines November and December. We did this to include the information from the Fall Conference. Yes, we were finally able to meet once again and have a Fall Conference. The attendance was pretty good for the Sons and our meetings well attended. I appreciate everyone that participated in the Committee and Commission meetings. They were very productive and the information passed down to the membership was fantastic.

The Member, Training and Development Committee presented two training classes at the Fall Conference. These were conducted on Friday afternoon prior to the start of the Conference. The classes were well attended and will continue next year. In addition to the Classes, a Round Table Question and Answer Session were held on Saturday afternoon. From the feedback from the members in attendance, the classes and Round Table were well received. The more we inform and train our Officers and Members, the stronger our Detachment will become.

We had several donations made at the Conference. The donations are as follows; Florida Special Olympics - \$5,530.00, The Child Welfare Foundation - \$1,750.00, Children's Organ Transplant Association - \$750.00, Project Vet Relief - \$15,136.00, and for the Detachment Commanders project of Fisher House - \$750.00. This is a total of \$23,916.00. Not bad totals for the Fall Conference. Detachment Commander Brian and I appreciate all your hard work to raise the money donated at the Conference.

There have been many questions about the MyLegion site and when will it be operational. If you are holding dues because you cannot get into the site to transmit, put them in the mail to Department Headquarters. (Download the transmittal form by clicking here). We can and do still receive dues this way. I read a list of Squadrons that have not yet submitted the Squadron Data Report to National Headquarters. Once the MyLegion site is up and running, National must have your Squadron information or you will still not be able to sign into the site. There are a process of checks and balances. First, submit the SDR (Can be submitted on line), Second, call or email for authorization, Third, National will contact Department to see if you are the Commander or Adjutant of the requesting Squadron. That is why you must submit the Squadron Officer Report to Department and Detachment. Please do not confuse this with the National SDR. Yes, National will verify your information, but more important is what you are supplying them and that is the amount of your Squadron dues and per capita. If and when we go live with this, if this information is not on file and a member of your Squadron goes on-line to pay, he will only be charged the per capita rate that is supplied to National by the Detachment. So you see, only the Squadron loses if you have not supplied the information to National and Department

We are now accepting Endorsements for Detachment Office and District Commanders and Vice Commanders. This will be published elsewhere in this issue of The Source. In addition, the Endorsements will be placed on the Detachment Website for anyone to revue.

With this being the Holiday Season, please keep our Service men and women in your prayers. Also remember those in our Communities that need a helping hand to get through this time of the Year. We are a great organization and can be proud of what we do for our Communities!!!

NEC Fall 2021 #5 Funding for the 50th National Sons of The American Legion Convention Commemoration Committee Passed

NEC Fall 2021 # 6 Creation of Standing Committee from and Funding for Century Committee (CENTCOM)

<u>Passed</u> by vote 29-15 Florida Voted Yes. Details of NEC FALL 2021 #6: This Resolution made CENT-COM a Standing Committee for 5 years and beyond into the next SAL century 2032 and funded CENT-COM.

Congratulations to <u>Safety Harbor Squadron 238</u> for their Thanksgiving Turkey Fry successes. Your efforts help promote who we are as Sons of the American Legion Members and tell the story of what we stand for. You are this month's 'Source Spotlight!'

Squadron 238 of Safety harbor has done it again! For the past 4 years the Squadron has been selling deep fried turkeys on Thanksgiving and has seen constant growth.

In the first year only 12 turkeys were sold. In the second year that number doubled to 24 and in the 3rd year it doubled again to 48.

This year, however, there were over double the number of turkeys sold at 104!

Twenty-nine volunteers cranked up 13 turkey fryers and began bright an dearly at 6:30am, finishing at 11:00am. There was fun to be had by all ages despite the early morning and chill in the air with the youngest volunteer being a whopping 3 years old!

The event was held in the parking lot of post 238 where the 3 deep fryers were set up with tables for seasoning, boxing, storing, and delivering the turkeys directly into cars of those who ordered them.

The event raised over \$2500 for the Squadron. With the continuing growth of Squadron 238, more community outreach, the increase in volunteers, and fun next year is set to be even larger!

Endorsements for Office



It is the policy of the Detachment of Florida that no endorsement be posted prior to the Annual Fall Conference. The Detachment of Florida provides this information for the benefit of our membership. The addition of endorsement information does not indicate support for an individual candidate by the Detachment of Florida.

In order for an endorsement to be posted to the Detachment Newsletter "The Source" or the Detachment Website, an endorsement letter must meet the following requirements.

- 1. Each endorsement letter must come from a Florida Squadron or Post and must be signed by the Squadron Commander and Squadron Adjutant, or the Post Commander and Post Adjutant or any combination of these.
 - a. The letter must be on Squadron or Post letterhead and include the date that the Squadron or Post made the endorsement and that the membership approved said endorsement.
 - b. This letter should contain information explaining why the individual should be considered for the office he is seeking and a narrative of positions held to show his leadership potential.
- 2. Endorsements will only be accepted for the elected Detachment Officers, District Commanders as follows:
 - Detachment Commander, Detachment Vice Commanders, National Executive Committeeman, National Executive Committeeman Alternate, Detachment Historian, Detachment Chaplain, Detachment Sergeant-At-Arms and the District Commanders


