Hello Sons!

I'd like to start this article by thanking all of the Area, District and Squadron Commanders for your prompt response in collecting and submitting the missing Squadron Officer Reports (SORs). I'm having them turned in to me weekly, which I then forward to the Department of Florida. I will be getting an updated list of missing SORs this week. If you haven't done so yet, please review the Squadron Directory that was distributed at the beginning of August, and fill out the Squadron Officer Report and email it to me. DO NOT EMAIL ME WITH JUST THE UPDATED INFORMATION. To process and update the information properly, the form must be completed and sent to Department. Send the completed form to me and I will forward it to department. The form can be found by clicking here.

Now let's talk Squadron Data Reports (SDRs) – we still have many Squadrons that have not submitted the Squadron Data Reports. This is a new form that was released when the new myLegion.org system was installed. This form allows the NATIONAL ORGINAZATION to properly enter the total dues amount to collect in the new system. As Membership Chairman John Jennings has stated repeatedly, these forms MUST be turned in EACH YEAR, even if your dues structure doesn't change. The form is fillable on your computer. You can complete it, save it and then email it in. It only takes a few minutes. Please take the time to do this ASAP if you haven't done so already. I've been provided the most recent SDR. Your Adjutant team will be reaching out to you all to have this information submitted. Like the SOR reports mentioned above, you can send them to me and I will forward them, that way I have record of them in case National says they do not have yours. The form is available by clicking here.

Talking about these reports brings me to my next talking point. In a conversation I had with John Jennings earlier this month we discussed the constant use of acronyms throughout our organization. While there are many seasoned members in our ranks, we have many more new members each year that may get confused by the "Alphabet Soup" they hear being used. While there are many others, here's a few of the most common terms you may hear:

- SOR: Squadron Officer Report (described above) This report must be completed and turned in to Department immediately after Squadron elections each year. This must be turned in BEFORE your end of year paperwork.
- SDR: Squadron Data Report (described above) This report must be completed yearly. A Good rule of thumb is to complete and submit it when you submit the above SOR.
- CSR: Consolidated Squadron Report The most important report. This report informs Detachment and National of all of your Squadron's Activities and donations. The information in these reports (there's a Detachment and National report) assists our parent organization, The American Legion, in having a voice in Congress when they are lobbying and fighting for veteran related issues.

I encourage all of you leaders reading this article to limit your use of acronyms without explaining what they are. It is our goal to "mentor ourselves out of a job" and educate of future leaders. One good way of doing that is by not assuming everyone knows what we're talking about when we start using acronyms.

REMINDER: Fall Conference will be Nov 18 – 20, 2022 at the Caribe Royal Orlando. If you are going, you can start booking rooms now. Your Membership, Training and Development (MTD) team is working on having training classes available on Friday, Nov 18 at Fall Conference. The itinerary for classes as well as for the rest of Fall Conference has yet to be finalized. Please look for more information on both to come soon. The final itinerary will be distributed through our email group, website, social media pages and through this publication.

Keep up the good work, keep increasing those communications and most of all HAVE FUN! If I can help in any way, I'm only a phone call or email away. Don't hesitate to reach out – it's NEVER a bother!

THE AMERICAN LEGION ★ PAST NATIONAL COMMANDER ★ 2010 - 2011



Tampa was chosen to host the 2025 National Convention, the first convention to be held in Florida since Orlando in 1997. While it is three years out, I thought I'd introduce the Committees that will be required to be filled by volunteers. A lot will rely on the Legionnaires, Auxiliary members, SAL members and Riders volunteers to make it a success.

There are 5 committees (Badges and Packets, Distinguished Guests, Information/ Registration, Memorial Service and Special Events) required by National to have a successful convention, plus a Tampa Liaison. I will give a brief description of the duties of each. More specific duties will be described as we get closer and need to start signing up volunteers.

The Liaison is someone with political connections locally and perhaps statewide. They may be asked to assist with agencies such as police, fire, public works, parks & recreation, mayor's office and airport officials. The individual should also be familiar with local businesses such as retail stores, restaurants, recreational facilities, transportation companies and other businesses that could impact convention activities.

The Badges and Packets Committee is responsible for setting up the Office located in the Convention Center. Badges and Packets for The American Legion, Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion are shipped from National Headquarters to this office. The bags must be assembled for each delegate for each Department. The estimated number of assistants needed is 28-30.

The Distinguished Guests Committee has a Chairman and two Vice Chairmen. The Vice Chairmen are the Distinguished Guests Registration Chairman and the Distinguished Guests Holding Area Chairman. The Committee will also need two full time drivers for the National Commander and for the National Adjutant. The estimated number of assistants needed is 2-6 for each committee. The duties of each committee are exactly as they sound.

The Information/Registration Committee mans the desks set up in the convention center to answer questions from the attendees. National will provide binders with lots of information in them. The estimated number of assistants needed is 8-10.

The Memorial Service Committee coordinates with the National Chaplain to set up the service, proved rooming arrangements that may be required and provide volunteers to assist with seating attendees. The estimated number of assistants needed is 3-5

The Special Events Committee coordinates meeting the requirements for all special events scheduled, whether it be obtaining permits, coordinating with city agencies (police, fire, sanitation, emergency management, etc.) and must be a resident of the city. The estimated number of assistants is 30 or more.

This brief overview will give you an idea of the immense project Florida has taken on, and how important your support and volunteering will be to its success.

Reinstate – Renew – Recruit – This would be a great Squadron meeting topic to discuss the meaning of each word and the value it brings to the Squadron. These three little words have a lot of meaning to the growth and success of your Squadron and to the Detachment. Membership is the life blood of our organization. As of our August 19th, 2022, membership report we have recruited 568 new members and renewed 1,917 members for at total of 2,485. We have always said we do a great job signing up new members. Let's find a way to reinstate our old members!

As of the writing of this article the Detachment has reached it's 10% target early. Congratulations on reaching our 10% target early with a 11.78% as of this article. Great job by all. We currently have 8 Districts at or over the 10% target being led by Districts #4, #11, & #9. Congratulations to all these Districts and their District staff members for a job well done. We also had 4 out of 6 Areas at or over the 10% target being led by the Southern, Eastern, & Northern Areas. Congratulations

to each on these Areas and your staff members on a job well done. Let's go to work on our October 6th, 25% target and stay ahead of the curve.

WE MUST stay focused and submitted our RE-QUIRED SDR (Squadron Data Report) form AN-NUALLY. This is no longer an option. Follow the instructions on the form and email our Detachment Adjutant Christian Rapp a copy (adjutant@floridasons.org) The form is available on our website. (www.floridasons.org)

For the Membership Committee to contact the Squadrons as may be necessary during the year, the Squadron Office Report form should have been turned in before Convention. If not done, please get this completed as it is an important tool

The Sons of The American Legion convened their 50th National Convention at the Miller Highlife Theater in Milwaukee Wisconsin August 26th through 28th 2022. Our Florida delegation, while small, it was mighty. Delegation Chairman Detachment Commander 2022 Brian Carter, Detachment Commander 2023 Gerard Sambets, Past National Commander and Delegation Secretary Jim Roberts, National Assistant Adjutant and Detachment Adjutant Emeritus Ed Sheubrooks National Executive Committeeman William D (Bil) Kelly, District Vice CDR. Jamie Grinis and Jessie. A big shout out of Thanks to all these men who took time out of their busy schedules to represent you at the National Convention.

After we travel halfway across the country, we get settled very early the next day. We start with our Standing Convention Committees at 8:30 AM. At 10 AM we have our pre-National Executive Committee Meeting. This is where our governing body finishes up all the 2022-year business.

Later on Day 1 August 26th, 2022 at 1 PM The National Convention is gaveled to order by National Commander Fox. This year's Day 1 ran longer due to the 50th National Convention Luncheon on Day 2, and the business of running our organization must still be done, and it was. On behalf of the Detachment of Florida, Commander Carter received the Child Welfare Foundation Award for the Largest Contribution in the Southern Region and a Certificate of Recognition from CWF for exceeding the \$1.00 per member.

Day 2 began with a visit from The American Legion Department of Florida Department Commander 2022 Jerry Brandt, Commander 2023 Eunise Butts, Adjutant Bruce Compton, PDC & NEC Elect Jim Ramos and PDC Larry White came and sat in with their Detachment at our Convention. This action proves that when we say "We Are Family" we all stick together. Thank you to the TAL Department Officers who took the time out of their busy convention schedule to sit in with their Sons of The American Legion at their National Convention. Unfortunately, just after they left The Detachment of Florida was presented with The American Legion National Shadow Box Award for the Most Dollars Contributed to The Veterans and Children's Foundation (renamed from TAL Endowment Fund). The final award was received by The Detachment of Florida the Snapshots of Service 2022 Award for Veterans Affairs on behalf of Florida Lakeshore Squadron 137 in Jacksonville. Detachment of Florida Commander 2023 Gerald Sambets became the 1st Detachment Commander to be awarded a Certificate of Completion for his attendance at the new National Detachment Commanders Class at National Convention.

The Convention adjourned and we went directly to the Milwaukee Hilton Crystal Ballroom for The 50th Anniversary Banquet in celebration of 50 years of Sons of The American Legion Conventions. The luncheon was a fabulous affair and our compliments to the Anniversary Committee for their outstanding job.

Day 3 started early at 8 AM and after opening business, the National Chaplain provides a Memorial Service with a tribute to all the members who passed into Squadron Everlasting. Immediately after the service we preseded into the election of the National Commander 2023 and 5 National Vice Commanders from each of the regions. Leading Candidate Chris Carlton from Indiana was elected Sons of The American Legion National Commander 2023 The Southern Region elected Ron Roberts from Mississippi National Vice Commander. Florida was recognized due to our National Assistant Adjutant Harold Thompson's absence and National Adjutant Tony Wright was called off the floor for business elsewhere. National Assistant Adjutant Ed Sheubrooks was tasked with providing all the delegates accreditation report and with running the election for National Commander and NVCs. Thank you, Ed, for your service to The Sons of The American Legion and The Detachment of Florida and for representing us with all you do. With the installation of the newly elected officers, the 50th Convention and the 90th year of the Sons of The American Legion passed into the books.

We wanted to share a program that we have re-engaged with that allows any Legion member or Veteran to donate to The Villages Workshop to obtain an Urn. This Urn is used to contain their ashes and can be interned at a National Cemetery or wherever the Veteran or family prefers. The program is structured to take the proceeds above cost for one Urn and to allow the woodshop to build 4 or 5 additional Urns for indigent Veterans at no cost.

There are many thousands of Veterans remains in cardboard boxes at mortuaries or funeral homes that we contend deserve a dignified resting place. This effort should result in a self-sustaining program to address this critical need. Any member of the American Legion, or qualified Veteran can support this program through a donation either for an Urn, or a direct donation to the workshop, or by contacting me.

The need skyrocketed during Covid, and the need is critical. The program is focused on the 5 National Cemeteries in central and northern Florida including Bushnell, Jacksonville, Cape Canaveral, Pensacola, and Tallahassee.


