I am writing this article from my home in the beautiful Southwestern Area in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian. Not only have the members of our beautiful community lost everything they have, many of our Posts have suffered catastrophic damage. Many may not reopen for many years, if at all.

The outpouring of support I have seen from Post Families and other organizations from around our great state in the time that has passed since Ian made landfall has been amazing and a bit overwhelming. These amazing people have given of themselves and took time to gather donations and supplies from their areas and communities and have delivered them by trailer/truck to the Southwestern Area. The actions of these people truly show that WE ARE FAMILY and are One Team Committed To One Dream!

BENEFITS AVAILABLE

In the wake of Hurricane Ian, I feel it is my duty as Adjutant to remind you of benefits that are available to you as Legionnaires and Sons. If you are Legionnaires or Sons in good standing (your dues are paid for the current year) at the time Ian landed, you are eligible for the American Legion National Emergency Fund.

The NEF is open to all American Legion Posts, American Legion Members and Sons of The American Legion Members. Legionnaires and sons are eligible for up to \$3,000 and Posts are eligible for up to \$10,000. Applications for NEF must be submitted WITHIN 90 DAYS of the disaster.

THE AMERICAN LEGION ★ PAST NATIONAL COMMANDER ★ 2010 - 2011



Tampa was chosen to host the 2025 National Convention, the first convention to be held in Florida since Orlando in 1997. While it is three years out, I thought I'd introduce the Committees that will be required to be filled by volunteers. A lot will rely on the Legionnaires, Auxiliary members, SAL members and Riders volunteers to make it a success.

There are 5 committees (Badges and Packets, Distinguished Guests, Information/ Registration, Memorial Service and Special Events) required by National to have a successful convention, plus a Tampa Liaison. I will give a brief description of the duties of each. More specific duties will be described as we get closer and need to start signing up volunteers.

The Liaison is someone with political connections locally and perhaps statewide. They may be asked to assist with agencies such as police, fire, public works, parks & recreation, mayor's office and airport officials. The individual should also be familiar with local businesses such as retail stores, restaurants, recreational facilities, transportation companies and other businesses that could impact convention activities.

The Badges and Packets Committee is responsible for setting up the Office located in the Convention Center. Badges and Packets for The American Legion, Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion are shipped from National Headquarters to this office. The bags must be assembled for each delegate for each Department. The estimated number of assistants needed is 28-30.

The Distinguished Guests Committee has a Chairman and two Vice Chairmen. The Vice Chairmen are the Distinguished Guests Registration Chairman and the Distinguished Guests Holding Area Chairman. The Committee will also need two full time drivers for the National Commander and for the National Adjutant. The estimated number of assistants needed is 2-6 for each committee. The duties of each committee are exactly as they sound.

The Information/Registration Committee mans the desks set up in the convention center to answer questions from the attendees. National will provide binders with lots of information in them. The estimated number of assistants needed is 8-10.

The Memorial Service Committee coordinates with the National Chaplain to set up the service, proved rooming arrangements that may be required and provide volunteers to assist with seating attendees. The estimated number of assistants needed is 3-5

The Special Events Committee coordinates meeting the requirements for all special events scheduled, whether it be obtaining permits, coordinating with city agencies (police, fire, sanitation, emergency management, etc.) and must be a resident of the city. The estimated number of assistants is 30 or more.

This brief overview will give you an idea of the immense project Florida has taken on, and how important your support and volunteering will be to its success.

As we work through our membership year let's all remember the three 3 R's of membership. Reinstate – Renew – Recruit – This would be a great Squadron meeting topic to discuss the meaning of each word and the value it brings to the Squadron. Just what do these three simple words mean to you and your Squadron. As of our September 15th, 2022, membership report we have recruited 1,037 new members and renewed 3,522 members for at total of 4,559. We have always said we do a great job signing up new members. Let's find a way to reinstate our old members!

We are now working on our 25% target, and we are well on our way to reaching that goal. As of our September 15th report we as a Detachment were at 21.19% with a National renewal rate of 16.55%. Our 25% target date is October 6th, 2022, and I am looking forward to what that number is and the possibilities of what it could be.

ZERO Squadrons – Why are there so many? We need to reach out to these Squadrons and get them going. I do understand that you will hear "my card is good until December 31st". We need to change that culture, and it is a culture issue. This is the way it has always been done! Let's change that culture. We had 48 ZERO Squadrons as of our September 15th report. This has got to get better.

WE MUST stay focused and submit our REQUIRED SDR (Squadron Data Report) form

ANNUALLY. This is no longer an option. Follow the instruction on the form and email our Detachment Adjutant Christian Rapp a copy (adjutant@floridasons.org) The form is available here.

For the Membership Committee and/or the Detachment Administration to contact your Squadrons during the year, your Squadron must submit the Squadron Office Report form. If not done, please get this completed as it is an important tool for our communication to you the Squadrons and for you to communicate to your membership. Why would you not want to communicate to your membership?

CREATIVITY

Ever wonder why some Squadrons seem to be active constantly while others don't? The answer is not complicated. The active Squadron has at least one member that is creative and the Officers do not stifle that creativity.

It takes a little commitment (see my last article). You do not need a large membership, but you need a member who is willing to put thoughts on paper and a Commander who is willing to hear the thoughts and encourage the participation.

Examples are easy to find. A day that honors a Legion Family Group or Military Branch. Create a flyer, acknowledging that day or Group. Then create a small ceremony to be held on the day.

If you notice I have used the word 'create' or a variation of 'create' a lot of times. That is because you need to put something together and see it through to completion. This is creativity.

Ok... here's an idea.

Using something that my Squadron is doing, I offer it as a template.

September 16th is POW-MIA Remembrance Day. It is always the 3rd Friday of September. Since my Post Family Groups hold a dinner each Friday, we decided to set up a Ceremony to honor and remember the 82000+ unaccounted for Americans. Every Post has a Missing Man Table, highlight it and the items that make up the table. Midway through the dinner, we ask for our customer's attention while offer a prayer for the missing and their families. We then explain the table items and their meaning. You can get all the information required for free on the Internet. We then place small battery operated candles (so we can use them again) on each dinner table and ask someone at each table to light the candle. Turning off as much lighting as possible, we have a candlelight vigil while we play an appropriate song or video. After the song, we turn on the lights and ask everyone to raise a glass to honor and remember the missing. We thank them for participating.

I can tell you that we get nothing but rave reviews. By advertising the Ceremony, we increase attendance for dinner. That helps the host group take in more money... Win-win.

In closing, remember one thing. If you don't try it, you will never get the warm feeling of accomplishment. That feeling will drive creativity to new heights.


