You can fill them out online and email them in instead of mailing them. Each form has a dead-line. Please look at each form carefully and submit them before the deadline.

PLEASE NOTE: The Squadron Officers Report (SOR) will be included in the packet. This form must be submitted **IMMEDIATELY AFTER YOUR ELECTIONS**. Once your elections are completed, send the form to Bekki Tibbs at Department (address is on the form). **DO NOT SEND THIS WITH YOUR END OF YEAR PAPERWORK**.

ENDORSEMENTS FOR OFFICE

Endorsements for Office are still coming in. There is still time to submit yours. If you would like to serve as an Area Commander, District or District Vice Commander or even a Detachment Officer, now is the time to get your endorsement in. The requirements for submitting your endorsement can be found on the Detachment Website at https://floridasons.org/detachment-officer-endorsements/. If you look at this page, you can see the endorsements sent in already. If you would like to run for office, even if someone else is, please submit your endorsement to me (email: adjutant@floridasons.org).

If National does not have this information, they will only collect the \$11 per capita. This means your Squadron will have to chase down the difference from your members that pay online. It only takes a few minutes. Complete the form and send it to me today.

Membership Team,

I am so proud to be a part of the Detachment of Florida! You guys just continue to do great thing and our membership is just on fire.

As of our February 16th, 2022, membership report we have recruited 3,209 new members and renewed 15,378 members for a total of 18,587 with these numbers the Detachment was standing at 86.37%. You guys are blowing the socks off the 80% target which is not until March 9th. What a great job by all! Lets all continue our efforts and give the Legion a wonderful Birthday present with a large membership percentage number. The sky is the limit, lets go big by March 9th --- 95% let's GO!

We have always said we do a great job signing up new members let's work to find a way to reinstate our old members! If we had renewed 18,587 members and recruited 3,209 members, just look at the difference in the numbers overall (21,796). Interesting to say the least! Is this possible? Yes, it is! We just need to do a much better job with renewal and reinstatements. But we can do it!

We have worked hard, and we now only have 3 ZERO Squadrons. I know that you are working on these and will get them corrected shortly. We do have another issue we need to address as we move toward Convention. We have 10 Squadrons as of this article that are below Squadron strength. We need to get the Squadrons up to STRENGTH and this number is 10. Let's get this done!

As we continue to work through our membership year let's all remember the three 3 R's of membership. *Reinstate* – *Renew* – *Recruit*. This would be a great Squadron meeting topic to discuss the meaning of each word and the value it brings to the Squadron. Just what do these three simple words mean to you and your Squadron.

Online membership renewal is available and as I understand it is working OK. The ones unable to do online membership is due to you not following the instruction of the Detachment. The Detachment has been communicating this for months and months it is now here. If you have not completed your REQUIRED SDR FORM, you might need to think about getting it completed and completed NOW. Detachment Adjutant Rapp has asked for everyone to send a copy to him of the transmittal for filing and verifications. Remember, THIS IS AN ANNUAL REQUIREMENT, that means this form needs to be completed and sent to National and a copy sent to our Detachment Adjutant every year. You might be running YOUR DUES PAYMENT down if YOUR SDR FORMS have not been completed and submitted to National. THINK!!!!

WE need to get focused and submitted our REQUIRED SDR (Squadron Data Report) form ANNUALLY. This is no longer an option to submit and must be submitted to National no later than MAY 1st of EACH YEAR BY EACH SQUADRON.

The instructions after the form have been completed. 1st-Save a copy for your Squadron's files. 2nd - email your submission to our <u>Detachment Adjutant Christian Rapp</u>. Adjutant Rapp will batch submit to the National IT Department as required, keeping records of those submissions which will hold the National IT Department accountable for correct or incorrect postings. We will get this resolved with your help and understanding. The form is available on our <u>website</u>.

We are also looking into WHOSE signature will be or need to be on the authorized signature line of the PRINTABLE CARDS. The authorized person on the printable cards is Anthony Wright our SAL National Adjutant.

Another form that is very important to the operation and success of the Detachment is the Squadron Office Report form. It is also available online. If not done, the Detachment has no easy way of contacting you or your Squadron. Please get

COMMUNICATION

PDC Carter preached all 2021-2022 that we need to Communicate Better. We, your Advisory Committee have been asking for years why we don't call one another, and why we don't email one another? Do we, not very often or at all? I can't tell you how many emails I send that are not replied to. Are we Lazy? Are we Rude? Do We Just Not Give A Damn? Maybe, but at Conference and Convention, everyone wants to stand up and volunteer and express their opinion, that's easy, but to think of, formulate, and write a reply, or call someone, that's much harder. Rude not really. I believe most of us are good people. LAZY, maybe, and most likely. Is everyone aware that most of our email services have an automatic reply, button or if not hit reply and type in thanks, so the sender knows you received it and may have read it, as long as it's not on the google list you're OK.

Chain of Command

Squadron Commanders Should call/email your District CDRs with questions. Not the Detachment Commander or other officers. District Commanders, you should be calling/emailing each of your Squadrons EVERY MONTH. If they raise a question you are unsure of and have said "I'll Find Out" You should be calling your Detachment Vice Commander for your Area. Not the Detachment Commander or other officers. Detachment Vice CDRs should be calling each of your District CDRs EVERY MONTH. If the Detachment Vice Commander is unsure it is his responsibility to call the Detachment Adjutant or Detachment Officers. WHY? Because we have a Chain of Command. Squadron, District, Detachment, National, and everyone learns from the answers to others' questions. If you are not following the chain of command you are disrespecting your superior officer. If you are answering questions that should be answered by a lower-ranking officer you're also part of the problem. If you were in the military or not, it means charges may be preferred. Another reason to follow the chain it keeps others in the loop. I Can't tell you how many calls over the years I have gotten and when I ask does your District CDR, DVC, know, they respond "No I just thought I would call you". It doesn't or shouldn't work that way FOLLOW THE CHAIN OF COMMAND, please.

Source Articles

Why are we not seeing articles from Detachment Officers? While I have seen a few Detachment Vice Commanders articles, a few District CDRs articles, and even fewer from Commission and Committee. Why? Nothing to say, Lazy, or just don't want to do the job you were elected or appointed to do. DO YOUR JOB!

Legislative Commission—Washington Conference

The American Legion gathers at the Washington Hilton for the Veterans lobbying and The Legislative Commission, and other TAL Commissions meetings including National Security, Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, and Finance meet for their mid-winter meetings every year at the end of February.

The Sons of The American Legion National Legislative Commission each year organizes a bus trip to memorialize veterans at monuments in Washington DC on Sunday the 1st day of the conference. We gather early Sunday morning just inside the lower level of the Hilton with over 30 wreaths. 3 wreaths for our National Commander to present. (see photos) One at Arlington National Cemetery's Tomb of the Unknown, one at the Vietnam Memorial Wall, and one at the World War II Memorial. There are very few things in life more stirring, than standing at the highest point in Arlington National Cemetery, the Tomb of the Unknown overlooking our Nation's Capital witnessing this solemn ceremony. Sons of The American Legion National Commander Chris Carlton along with his wife and 2 young members from the New York delegation presenting our wreath at the Tomb. This year we had three busloads of over 160 American Legion Family members attended. This year two of our FL. Legionnaires attended with us, Jim Bowers and Larry Roberts who are also dual members and we are always looking for more of our Department of Florida Family to accompany us. Start making plans to attend next year's trip. Yes, it is an expensive weekend, but it is important to show support and unity for a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

Our Detachment of Florida wreath was placed at the Vietnam Memorial Wall for all our Florida Veterans who were called to duty and those who paid the ultimate price for our country. We return to the Hilton after a 6-hour trip around Washington.

The next day Monday begins with TAL Legislative Commission Chairman LaCoursiere's call to order which I attend for almost 4 hours. TAL is still pushing Voters Voice and Florida was the top Department in Legislative Contacts and that was because you loaded the QR code, registered, and contacted our Legislators. The Sons of The American Legion National Liaison Mook put on a luncheon for the SAL attendees which was quite unexpected. Later on in the afternoon, the entire Florida Delegation attended TAL "Know Before You Go" this highlights the Legislative Agenda to be discussed the next day with our Legislators.

Tuesday starts very early with the Commander's Call where CDR Troiola introduced speakers from both the Senate and the House of Representatives from both sides of the aisle. At this meeting, The Department of Florida CDR Butts, & PDC Brandt received The National Legislative Commission Advocacy Award for the most Congressional Contacts in 2022. While the contacts are uncategorized, I believe you the SAL Detachment of Florida were responsible for a large percentage because of our use of the QR code at Conference and in the Source.

Thank you and please continue to register and contact our National Legislators regarding the Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxins Act (PACT Act) wouldn't have passed without your contacts.

Later that afternoon PNC Clarence Hill and I visited Florida Sr. Senator Marco Rubio's Office and spoke with his Veteran's Legislative Aide Ryan Rasin because the Senator was at the Senate Intelligence Committee meeting. Ryan was quite well-versed as we went over The American Legion Legislative Agenda with him. When we finished, we asked Senator Rubio's aide to make sure to thank the Senator for addressing the Department of Florida Convention and for his support of the PACT Act and The American Legion Legislative Agenda.

Our next appointment was with Florida's 4th Congressional District newly elected Representative Aaron Bean. PNC Hill knew Representative Bean from his son at TAL Dept. of FL. Boys State and I had met Representative Bean in Tallahassee as a FL. State Legislator several years ago. PNC Hill took the lead, and we went point by point of the TAL Agenda including Mental Health & Suicide Prevention, VA Modernization, PACT Implementation and Oversite, Protection of Veterans from Predators specifically the Camp LeJeune lawsuits, Parity for the Guard & Reserves, Pay for the Coast Guard and Protecting the American Flag. We thanked Representative Bean and he volunteered to speak at any of our TAL Posts in the future.

Wednesday is the day that The American Legion National Commander Vincent J "Jim" Troiola's Testimony before the joint session of the House and Senate Committees on

Veteran Affairs. 
American Legion Post 189 Unveils POW Monument in Sebastian

A new POW/MIA monument was unveiled Sunday at Riverview Park in Sebastian, Florida. Sebastian Squad 189 of Sons of the American Legion <u>raised the funds</u> for the dedication.

Past Commander Peter Puzzo spoke about the Prisoner of War/Missing in Action monument.

"Today, we specifically honor those heroes and Patriots," said Puzzo. "We keep their memories alive until they are all brought home."

Other officials at the ceremony were Se-



Puzzo said the brass stars on the Prisoner of War/Mission in Action monument are melted-down brass made from the grommets of American flags retrieved after they were retired from service.

"Thereby showing that our flag never dies," said Puzzo.

In 2014, the idea to bring a stone monument honoring those of POW/MIA was from Puzzo, funded through local donations.

Since WWI, more than 82,000 Americans are still unaccounted for from wars and conflicts.

"The third Friday of September is designated as POW/MIA remembrance day. April 9th is considered POW/MIA family day. On both those days, we will place a solar light in front of this monument so that it shines for that whole evening," Puzzo said.

The POW/MIA monument is located at Riverview Park (east of the splash pad) next to the American Flag.

Endorsements for Office



It is the policy of the Detachment of Florida that no endorsement be posted prior to the Annual Fall Conference. The Detachment of Florida provides this information for the benefit of our membership. The addition of endorsement information does not indicate support for an individual candidate by the Detachment of Florida.

In order for an endorsement to be posted to the Detachment Newsletter "The Source" or the Detachment Website, an endorsement letter must meet the following requirements.

- 1. Each endorsement letter must come from a Florida Squadron or Post and must be signed by the Squadron Commander and Squadron Adjutant, or the Post Commander and Post Adjutant or any combination of these.
 - a. The letter must be on Squadron or Post letterhead and include the date that the Squadron or Post made the endorsement and that the membership approved said endorsement.
 - b. This letter should contain information explaining why the individual should be considered for the office he is seeking and a narrative of positions held to show his leadership potential.
- 2. Endorsements will only be accepted for the elected Detachment Officers, District Commanders as follows:
 - a. Detachment Commander, Detachment Vice Commanders, National Executive Committeeman, National Executive Committeeman Alternate, Detachment Historian, Detachment Chaplain, Detachment Sergeant-At-Arms and the District Commanders

Endorsement letters must be submitted, in writing, to the Detachment Adjutant as follows with the required signatures (in the format listed above).

- 1. Endorsement letters can be sent via the US Postal Service to the Detachment Adjutant Christian Rapp 215 Greenwood Ave, Lehigh Acres, FL 33936-1452.
- 2. Endorsement letters can be scanned and sent by e-mail to the Detachment Adjutant at adjutant@floridasons.org. Scanned documents are required to be in an Adobe Portable Document Format (.pdf) and must have all of the original signatures as required and be of good quality.


