For our membership campaign to be a great success, we must work on it each day. Membership is not a part time job – it is a full-time job, and it requires WORK. When a Squadron reaches the 100% goal and does not move from that 100%, what does that tell you? I watch this, and I hope all of you will also.

Membership numbers should always be moving in a positive way and never standing still. If a Squadron is to grow it must add new members if they and the Detachment are to grow. We have plenty of resources in Florida and we must reach out to them if the Detachment is to grow.

The Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Florida met for their Fall Conference November 17th, 18th, & 19th at the Caribe Royale Resort in Orlando FL. We hope you were there but If you were not able to attend you can start now to arrange your schedule for the Detachment Convention in June of 2024 and next Fall's Conference in November of 2024, information will be available soon.

The importance of attending Fall Conference was designed for education of our membership through training and reports by our Commissions, Committee, and Officers. Our Member Training and Development Committee on Friday conducted classes for Squadron Commanders, Squadron Adjutants, and District Commanders. The response was overwhelmingly positive, and the committee intends to continue and expand its training program. Chairman Ray Well Done.

Our Detachment also convenes a Detachment Executive Committee Meeting first thing on Saturday morning at Fall Conference. All elected Detachment Officers are required to attend or provide an excuse to Commander Sambets and/or Adjutant Rapp. The Detachment Executive Committee meets to vote on all actions brought before it as to the running of the Detachment. All members may attend without voice or vote, thereby observing and learning about the workings of the Detachment Executive Committee.

My National Executive Committeeman Report to our officers started by asking how many of our officers received The Source, our Detachment Newsletter, and how many read it. If you would like to read it or be refreshed you may go to floridasons.org and read the NEC Report in the November Source which describes in detail our NEC Fall Meetings.

One of the big events you'll be hearing a lot about is The American Legion Family Day on Saturday April 27th 2024. TAL National CDR Dan Seehafer, ALA National President Lisa Williamson, and SAL National CDR JR Hall, have joined forces to ask every Post, Unit, Squadron to open your Post's Social Quarters doors to the public to highlight your Legion contributions to the community. Join in with your Post leadership and call up your local newspapers, radio and TV stations, send flyers and let everyone know about America's Largest Veteran Organization. Tell them how the Sons of The American Legion Nationally donated \$114 million to veterans, children, and our community. Get started planning today.

Both TAL National CDR Dan, ALA National President Lisa, and SAL National CDR JR will continue the BE THE ONE campaign to combat Veteran Suicide. They also are asking the SAL for a small 10% increase of our National Consolidated Reports. Last year only 31% of the Squadrons reported nationally. If we just increased that by 10% we could possibly report another \$11 million to The American Legion.

The Sons of The American Legion in 2022-2023 were responsible for 62% of all money donated to The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation. This year we are 24% above last year at this time. The Sons of The American Legion are closing in on a significant milestone of \$10 million in donations to the CWF and a celebration is being planned when we reach that goal. Look forward to more information on the celebration.

- The National Member Training & Development Committee has the funding now and has rolled out its 1st class and will be starting full time for The SAL University, more information coming soon.
- The National Membership Committee wants you to remember "Everyone Says 400" as the SAL moves closer to 400,000 membership goal. The new realignment at National has the Southeast Region leading the Five Regions in membership.
- The National Convention Committee and its newest member Florida's own Gerard Sambets is looking forward to New Orleans and will continue to work towards TAL National Convention in Tampa 2025.
- The Detachment of Florida continues looking for a few good Sons as candidates for the National Commission and Committees.

- The Internal Affairs Commission is working to get TAL Family Day included on the SAL Squadron Consolidated Reports this year.
- Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Commission wants every member to be aware that Veterans Affairs Voluntary Services has allowed the SAL to be its own certifying agency for VAVS at Veterans Hospitals. Become a SAL VAVS volunteer at a veterans hospital today. VA&R wants its Squadrons to start looking for candidates for Charles B Rigsby VA&R National Volunteer of the year.
- The Public Media & Communications Commission is working on an electronically delivered national newsletter with a release date early next year. They want to remind you to get your Snapshots and Videos of Service submitted as soon as possible for award consideration.
- The National Finance Commission submitted its 2024-2025 to the SAL NEC for consideration.

That ended my NEC Report for the Detachment Executive Committee followed by all the other officer reports and the conclusion of our DEC Meeting.

The meeting opened with CDR Sambets calling the Fall Conference meeting to order and roll call of Officers and Squadrons by Adjutant Rapp. The Commission & Committee assignments and reports were started.

My Fall Conference Report as Chairman of the Legislative Commission thanked the attendees and the Detachment of Florida for the recognition as recipient of the Legislative George B Evans National Grassroots Veterans Advocate of the year 2023 award. I explained that all I did was to encourage our membership to contact their Congressman and Senators. They did the work and I thanked them for all they did and showed them the cover I was presented with.

The Detachment of FL will once again be represented in Washington presenting a Florida memorial wreath to memorialize our WW II & Vietnam Veterans on Sunday February 25, 2024 on the SAL Bus Trip.

My other report as Chairman of the CDRs Advisory was used to dispel rumors to the effect that the Advisory Committee ran the Detachment of Florida. I explained that the committee has Six Past Detachment CDRs, Five Past National Vice CDRs, and one Past National CDR with over 150 years of experience to assist our CDR with a successful year. I explained we do not tell anyone what to do, we advise and counsel the CDR and our Detachment Officers. The Detachment of Florida is run only by the Detachment Executive Committee made up of the elected Detachment Officers, Past Detachment CDRs, and delegates of the Detachment of Florida Convention.

After our presentation of our special guest to The American Legion, The American Legion Auxiliary, and The American Legion Riders at their meetings it was my privilege to introduce our keynote speaker. A friend I've known and worked with for almost 10 years out of Squadron 40 in Glen Burnie Maryland Don (JR) Hall. CDR Hall spoke to the importance of honoring his grandfather's service. The importance of serving veterans and The Four Pillars of The American Legion.

The New Math

At the Fall Conference we spoke of the new math where one event could give your Squadron credits for two or three categories.

The way it works is by completing an Event, for example a Class on Flag Etiquette, you not only get credit for an Americanism Event but depending on the audience, say a classroom, you have helped Children and Youth thereby getting that credit. If your audience was a civic group, you provided a Community Activity and so on.

But it all means nothing if you don't get credit for the effort. Start today by keeping a record of everything your Squadron does by taking attendance, logging the hours of the Event, and don't forget the preparation and clean up. Out of pocket expenses can be supplies used, mileage and anything else that was bought or paid for by the Squadron or members.

Now if you complete the Event, put your records in a book. In that book, you should have a blank copy of all the different year end reports we complete. Simply list the members, the hours used, expenses and miles traveled. Don't forget to note the different categories you touched on. By the end of the year your reports will be basically completed.

The man-hours translate to dollars because the IRS credits a figure of about \$29-30 per hour for our volunteerism.

Try this for December and see if it doesn't begin to make sense to you a little more. Nobody likes paperwork but it's what drives home what our value as an organization is in relationship to the Legion and your community.

Squadron #347 Urn Project


For a number of years a group of central Florida craftsmen, The Villages Woodworkers Club (VWC), has been constructing wooden urns exclusively for the ashes of indigent Veterans in Central Florida. The goal is to make sure that these forgotten Veterans, often with no known family, get the respect they deserve in their final resting place.

In various ways over the years the VWC has distributed these urns for the 2 or 3 National cemeteries in central Florida. In 2019, the VWC woodworkers asked The Sons of The American Legion Squadron #347 in Lady Lake, FL, to take over the distribution of the urns, and also to expand the distribution to other National cemeteries in Florida. Since 2019 this joint team has distributed over 250 urns to five Central & Northern Florida National Cemeteries, the Marion County Veterans Cemetery, as well as to the Missing in America Project (MIAP) in Brevard County.

The urns are supplied free of charge, to be used to inter the ashes of indigent Veterans.


