- All endorsements must be on Post/Squadron letterhead and must have **two** signatures.
- Signatures can be any combination of Post or Squadron Commander and Post or Squadron Adjutant.
- YOU CANNOT SIGN YOUR OWN ENDORSEMENT if you currently hold one of these positions.

### **USAGE OF ACRONYMNS**

Internal Affairs Chairman John Jennings talked about this at Fall Conference. I felt that it is worth repeating. In today's world, especially in business, there are many acronyms that get thrown around. We have many in our organization such as SDR, SOR and CSR. While acronyms may seem handy, this 'alphabet soup' is often very confusing – even for those who have used the acronyms for years. We as leaders should reduce the usage of acronyms. This will make things clearer to others and help keep us all on the same page. If you use acronyms, try to get in the habit of spelling out what they mean and then referencing the acronym afterwards (see what I did above for the acronym 'MT&D').

All of the information you need to start a new squadron has been on the national website until the recent website redesign. I've added this paperwork to **OUR** website to make it easier for you to find. NOTE: new squadron paperwork must be sent to THE AMERICAN LEGION DEPARTMENT OF FLORIDA and not to me. Their address can be found on the floridalegion.org website.

If you are holding an event that you would like Commander Cirigliano to attend, please send him an invitation. This allows the Commander to put the event on his schedule and plan his travels. I hope you all have a truly Blessed Christmas and a Happy New Year!



So we're growing our membership base while continuing to support the post.



# THE AMERICAN LEGION PAST NATIONAL COMMANDER 2010-2011 2025 TAMPA CONVENTION CORP PRESIDENT



At Convention, I made a short presentation at a session of the Legion, Auxiliary and SAL conventions. A summary is as follows:

- 1) Department has developed a volunteer form that should be available on each organization's website. A lot will rely on the Legionnaires, Auxiliary members, SAL members and Riders volunteers to make the Convention a success, and we need members of each organization to contribute. We've had nearly twenty members submit the form. Again, the Committees are: Badges and Packets, Distinguished Guests, Memorial Service, Information/Registration and Special Events. There is a place on the form to indicate which committee you would like to serve and whether or not you'd like to be a Chairperson. I will take note now of those who would like to chair a committee, serve as the Tampa liaison or be the driver for the National Commander or the National Adjutant. We will have a meeting at the Fall Conference this year to finalize those appointments. It'll be next year before we put the rest of the team together. If you are attending the New Orleans National Convention next month, you might ask those Louisiana folks serving on the committee you are interested in.
- 2) Some Posts have indicated a desire to provide a display at the Convention. Those requests must be approved by National, Florida does not control them. Contact Bridget Robinson at brobinson@legion.org. She will process your request.
- 3) There is also a form on the National Website, legion.org, for those Posts interested in hosting a Department's party or social gathering. Bridget is also the point of contact for those requests.
- 4) Conventions are not cheap- I expect the Convention to cost \$400,000 or more, with the largest cost being the bus transportation. This year, Legislative Chairman Stu Scott worked hard to get budget money from the Legislature to help offset the transportation cost, but was unsuccessful. We will try again next year, but will need a lot of lobbying help from the grassroots making contact with their State Senators and Representatives and supporting the effort. It's not too early to make that contact.
- 5) One of the first deadlines Florida needs to meet concerns the Memorial Service. That Committee coordinates with the National Chaplain to set up the service, provide rooming arrangements that may be required and provide volunteers to assist with seating attendees. Most importantly, we need to identify well-known local groups that are willing to perform at this event. We need to provide National with a number of options by January, and National will pursue booking them. If you have any suggestions, submit them to Bruce or me.

This overview gives you an idea of the immensity of the project Florida has taken on, and how important your support and volunteering will be to its success. Hosting a National Convention is not an easy task, and every member of all the other Departments is a critic. If you can help in any way or have any ideas, please provide them. If you can volunteer in any way, we need you.






