Hello Sons!

It's that time of the year! We meet in Orlando for our 53rd Annual Convention in just **TWO MONTHS!** Now is the time to start holding your District Constitutional Conferences to elect your District Leadership for the 2025-2026 year. It is also time for every squadron to start working on their end of year reports. With the end of the year upon us, the focus of my article again this month to provide you the information you need to prepare for the end of year 'festivities'.

END OF YEAR REPORTING

Department sent out the end of the year packets the week of March 16, 2025. I have mine of my squadron, you should have your too. If you haven't seen the packets and you get mail at your Post, check with your Post Adjutant. If you receive mail via a PO Box, make that trip to the Post Office NOW. If you've done the above and still can't locate your packet (it's a letter size manilla envelope) please email Bekki at Department HQ. Her information can be found on the **floridalegion.org** website.

The new date for all reports to be submitted is **MAY 15.** This gives your Adjutant team time to collate the data and prepare for Convention. If you have the capability of filling out the reports on your computer, you can find all of the report forms on our website at https://floridasons.org/detachment-report-forms/.

THE ONLINE SUBMITTAL PORTAL IS LIVE!

For those of you who are tech-savvy, I've created an online report submission portal. On just one page, you can submit all of the important reports such as your Consolidated Squadron Reports, Squadron Information Reports and even your District Officer Reports. Look for the **REPORT SUBMISSION** link in the reporting menu of our website.

Reporting Meetings: Area and District Commanders: A good suggestion for getting squadrons to complete their reports would be to hold a meeting in your Districts and Areas and get a representative from each squadron to attend and assist them in completing their reports as a group. The 16th District does this each year and usually has 100% reporting in their district. If your Districts are spread out, you may want to hold two meetings. If you need help in completing your reports, or are not sure what qualifies for what report(s), please reach out to an experienced member in your area. You can also email the Committee and Commission Chairmen, as well as Member Training and Development (MT&D) for assistance.

CHANGES IN THE REPORTING PACKETS

There have been a few changes this year. I encourage everyone to open the packet and go through it, even if you use the forms online to complete your reporting. Here's a couple of notable changes:

- Annual Squadron Data Report (SDR) John Jennings will talke about this in his article, we've also sent out
 emails recently about this. This report only needs completed if your squadron information (such as dues) has
 changed or needs corrected. If you are submitting an SDR, DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING BLANK.
- Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Report (VA&R) VA&R Chairman George Worton has revised the instructions on this page to help everyone better understand how to complete the report. Please read these instructions (especially Section II) prior to completing your report. Everything we do at our squadrons counts in some way for VA&R—EVERYONE SHOULD BE COMPLETING A VA&R REPORT.

ENDORSEMENTS FOR OFFICE

Endorsements for office are coming in. IYou can see a list of the current endorsements at the end of this edition before the special events flyers. You can also find them on our website at https://floridasons.org/detachment-officer-endorsements/. If you look at the current list (at the time of this writing), there are only 7 out of 16 endorsements for District Commander and only 40 out of 6 endorsements for District Vice Commander. We need leaders! If you are considering running for a Detachment Officer Position, or a District Commander/Vice Commander position you may now submit your endorsement. There is a format that all endorsements should follow:

- All endorsements must be on Post/Squadron letterhead and must have two signatures.
- Signatures can be any combination of Post or Squadron Commander and Post or Squadron Adjutant.
- YOU CANNOT SIGN YOUR OWN ENDORSEMENT if you currently hold one of these positions.

DISTRICT CONSTITUTIONAL CONFERENCES (DCC)

I am asking all District Commanders to provide information on their DCCs. To date, I only have a handful of notifications. We will be emailing each District and District Vice Commander to get this list. Watch your email from one of our Detachment Assistant Adjutants. I would like to distribute this list via email and our website so that anyone running for office could attend your meetings, as well as Commander Cirigliano.

SQUADRON ELECTIONS

Per Article X, Section 13 of our Detachment Constitution:

"All officers of Squadrons, except the Squadron Adjutant and the Squadron Judge Advocate, shall be elected and certified to the Department Adjutant and Detachment Adjutant, not more than ninety (90) days, nor less than ten (10) days prior to the Annual Detachment Convention, certification to be made on forms furnished or prescribed by the Detachment Adjutant."

The first day of our Annual Convention this year will be **June 13, 2025**. This means that your squadron elections cannot be <u>any sooner</u> than **MARCH 15, 2025** and <u>no later than **JUNE 3, 2025**</u>. Once your elections are complete, you must immediately send in the Squadron Information Report (SIR). This form provides information on your elected officers that not only lets Department and Detachment build their directories, but allows Department to assign permissions in the mylegion.org system to those who process membership. The form can be found on our website, and will also be included in your end of year packets.

That's all for now. Please let me and your Detachment Adjutant Staff know if you need anything.

I had the honor of attending the American Legion Washington Conference February 22-26, 2025. Here is my report:

The Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Florida attended The American Legion Washington Conference February 22nd through 26th 2025 at The Washington Hilton and Capital Hill in Washington D.C.

We traveled to D.C. and on Sunday participated in The Sons of The American Legion National Legislative Commission Annual Bus Trip to Memorialize our fallen heroes in the Washington D C area. The Florida American Legion Family delegation on our bus trip included Department Adjutant Bruce Comer & wife, Legislative Chairman Stuart Scott & wife, PDC Jerry Brant & PDP Wanda Brant, DVC Central & SAL Liaison Mike (Tank) Sherman, VA Chairman Larry Roberts, Past Eastern Area Joe Marcheggiani.

The Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Florida purchased the wreath and our Florida Delegation presented the wreath at the WWII Memorial, VietNam Memorial Wall and the Korean War Memorial. We then proceeded across the Potomac River to Arlington National Cemetery and at 1 PM we observed The Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. At 1:15 The Sons of The American Legion National Commander Joseph Navarrete presented a wreath at The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

Monday morning arrived and for the first time The American Legion National Legislative Commission had their Commission Meeting on Capitol Hill in the U.S. House of Representive's Cannon House Office Building. Department of Florida Legislative Chairman Stuart Scott and I sat in and observer PNVC and current National Legislative Commission Vice Chairman Paul Martel(FL) participated in the Commission. The Commission Chairman Mathew Shuman outlined The American Legion 2025 Legislative Priorities & Agenda for The 119th Congress 1St Session. The Commission had things well organized with transportation to and from Capitol Hill.

Monday afternoon was "The Commander's Call". This is where our national leaders of The American Legion Family CDR. James LaCoursiere, ALA. President Trish Ward and SAL CDR Joseph Navarrete. The guest speaker was the Secretary of Veterans Affairs Doug Collins. Secretary Collins who is also an ordained Minister and served in the U.S.Air Force as a Chaplain during the Iraq War is quite an enthusiastic speaker. He gave his pledge to The American Legion Family, Veterans will be taken care of, for which he received an arousing response from the 1000 or so attendees.

Tuesday Morning starts bright and early with the "Know Before You Go" This is the briefing for everyone to familiarize themselves with The Legislative Priorities before we head over to Capitol Hill.

My assignment from The American Legion Department of Florida was to meet with U.S. House of Representative Arron Bean (FL-4) at 1PM in the 2459 Rayburn House Office Building. Unfortunately Congressman Bean was attending a Ways and Means Committee meeting and other obligations on the Floor of the House of Representatives. Luckily for me I was able to meet with recently promoted Chief Legislative Council Richard LaMura who I've met on several previous occasions and having made the appointment several weeks in advance I was able to email over The American Legion Priorities.

When I was received into the new office of Congressman Bean by Mr LaMura I handed him The American Legion Legislative Agenda with my business card pinned with a "Be The One" pin. I asked that Richard pass on our thanks for supporting our servicemen and women and veteran legislation. We discussed The Veterans Administration and told Richard that Secretary of the V.A. Doug Collins was in to speak with us the day before. We wanted to be sure that the Congressman knows how important National Security and Lethality of the U.S. Armed Forces are to the American Legion. We also wanted to pass along the importance of the Parity needed for the Reserves and National Guard. We also believe in the Modernization of the Transition Assistance Program (TIA) and of course legislation to protect The U.S. Flag. We spent close to 45 minutes and I thanked Richard for his time hoped to see him next year.

I next proceeded to House of Representative Kat Cammack (FL-3) just around the corner 2421 Rayburn House Office Building for my appointment. Meeting up with Department CDR Hamrick and Legislative Chairman Scott we entered and met up with Congresswoman Cammack's Veterans Services Director Dave Hill. I handed Mr Hill The American Legion Legislative Agenda with my business card pinned to it with a Be The One pin. Since it was my honor to be accompanied by the CDR and Chairman I decided to turn the meeting over to them. After a discussion of about 45 minutes which included Department of Veteran Affairs and National Security Mr Hill had one of the Congresswoman's staff walk us over for a staff tour of the Capitol and escorted us to the U.S. Senate tram that we boarded to ride over to the Hart Senate Office Building.

Our next appointment was at 110 Hart Senate Office Building with the U.S. Senator Rick Scott. Unfortunately the Senator was on the floor of the Senate so we met with Legislative Assistant Sarah Salas. The American Legion Florida Legislative Team all met at Senator Scott to show unity for all the veterans legislative support Governor & now Senator Scott has shown to veterans.

That evening the Department of Florida took the entire Legislative Team out for an enjoyable dinner. The next day we flew home knowing we had done our utmost to enhance veterans legislation.

When a bill is about to be voted on you will receive a notice email to contact your Congressman or Senator. By already being registering with Voter Voice all you will need to do is click on the email and a prewritten email is sent to your Congressman or Senator supporting the veteran legislation. Simply go to www.legion.org/advocacy/legislative and click on grassroots or use the QR code.

Finally I would like to thank The American Legion Department of Florida Commander Hamrick, Adjutant Comer, Legislative Chairman Scott and the rest of the Florida Family Washington Conference Legislative Team for your inclusion and support of The Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Florida Legislative Commission.

RECTITUDE AND RIGHTEOUSNESS

A great American, Patrick Henry, who served our nation in its earliest days is, for some reason, one of the least quoted of our founding Fathers.

Henry's legacy includes being a representative to the First Continental Congress where he signed the Petition to the King, a document he helped to draft. His popularity in his home state of Virginia grew substantially due to his skills as an orator, and as an articulate and outspoken man who stood firm regarding our God given rights and the injustices heaped upon the colonies from the King and his government.

That being said, the most famous quote from this hero of our past is one that rings clear even to this day in the hearts and minds of all of us who seek to preserve the liberties granted to us by God and written into the great works that formed the first Government of the United States of America: "Give me liberty or give me death"

But these words alone do not define the man, nor his purpose. Henry served as the first and sixth post-colonial Governor of Virginia. Henry gave a glimpse into what made him such a staunch supporter of our Liberty and, what also relieved him from caring what those who opposed him had to say in a speech given on the 5th of June, 1788, two years after his final term as Governor. In that historic speech, he stated "Conscious rectitude is a powerful consolation".

Rectitude is a word seldom used in today's lexicon, but it is perfect as spoken by Henry in that fateful speech. Rectitude is 'morality, rightness of principle or practice; uprightness of mind; exact conformity to truth, or to the rules prescribed for moral conduct either by divine or human laws."



This, my friends, is yet another example of the faith in the one true God that our founding fathers kept so dear. We are a nation founded with the base knowledge that God's law is above all others. We are a nation who's construct is steeped in the truths of the Holy Bible and God's word. We are a nation that needs, in my humble opinion, to return to an undying undertone of Conscious Rectitude. A rightness and righteousness of spirit and mind, within the lanes of our own ability, and guided by the truths given to us by our Lord God.

Regardless of the politics of our leaders, this underlying faith is what made us a great nation and what keeps us a great nation. This underlying faith is something we all should focus on and keep alive in our hearts. This underlying faith should be seen in what we do, in our interactions with friend and foe alike and it must continue to be what we teach our children and our grandchildren, so that *their* children and grandchildren can stand tall in the Liberty that has been granted to us by God.

Keep the faith. Always remember you are a child of God!



As the Florida Legislature is in session, it is very important that you contact your state representatives to lobby for transportation money from this year's budget for this convention. Deadlines will start moving faster as we get closer. Hosting a National Convention is not an easy task, costs a lot of money and every member of all the other Departments is a critic. This is a great opportunity to showcase Florida. If you can help in any way or have any ideas, please provide them. If you can volunteer in any way, we need you. - 2) Endorsements will only be accepted for the elected Detachment Officers, District Commanders as follows:
 - Detachment Commander, Detachment Vice Commanders, National Executive Committeeman, National Executive Committeeman Alternate, Detachment Historian, Detachment Chaplain, Detachment Sergeant-At-Arms and the District Commanders

Endorsement letters must be submitted, in writing, to the Detachment Adjutant as follows with the required signatures (in the format listed above).

- Endorsement letters can be sent via the US Postal Service to the Detachment Adjutant Christian M Rapp at 215 Greenwood Avenue, Lehigh Acres, FL 33936.
- 2) Endorsement letters can be scanned and sent by e-mail to the Detachment at ad-jutant@floridasons.org. Scanned documents are required to be in an Adobe Portable Document Format (.pdf) and must have all of the original signatures as required and be of good quality.
