

As our Annual Convention is NEXT MONTH (June 12-15) my main focus for this article will be reporting.

The deadline for most reports was May 15th, 2025. Due to the error sending out the National and Detachment Consolidated Squadron Reports, the deadline has been extended to allow yu time to get them in. *Please have your reports submitted no later than June 1, 2025.* Your Adjutant Team and Committee Chairmen need time to collate these reports and tabulate the data BEFORE Convention. *NOTE: As of 2024, Volunteer time is worth \$30/hr.* Use this figure when completing your reports.

NOTE: THE NATIONAL CSR CAN BE COMPLETED THROUGH YOUR MYLEGION.ORG PORTAL. WHEN YOU SIGN IN AND GO TO YOUR SQUADRON PAGE, THERE WILL BE A BIG BLUE BUTTON ON THE SCREEN THAT SAYS SUBMIT CPR/CSR REPORTS. CLICK THIS AND COMPLETE YOUR REPORT.

NOTE: SAVE A COPY OF YOUR SUBMISSION CONFIMATION FOR YOUR RECORDS. THIS WILL SERVE TWO PURPOSES:

- 1) IT LETS YOU KEEP A RECORD OF YOUR SUB-MISSION IN CASE NATIONAL SAYS THEY HAVE-N'T RECEIVED YOUR REPORT.
- YOU CAN USE THE INFORMATION TO COM-PLETE YOUR DETACHMENT CSR.

THE ONLINE SUBMITTAL PORTAL

For those of you who are tech-savvy, I've created an online report submission portal. On just one page, you can submit all of the important reports such as your Consolidated Squadron Reports, Squadron Information Reports and even your District Officer Reports. Go to floridasons.org/report-submission to upload your reports.

PAY ATTENTION WHEN YOUR ARE COMPLETING AND SUBMITTING YOUR REPORTS!

I have received some reports via snail mail where the submitting squadron didn't fill out their squadron information. At this time of the year, as you can imagine, my mail box is full of reports. When received, I usually just take the reports out and sort them in piles, throwing the envelopes they came in away. If you don't take the time to review your reports for completeness, your squadron may not get credit for their efforts.

TAKE NOTE: SOME REPORTS ARE TWO PAGES

The Detachment Consolidated Squadron Report (CSR) is TWO PAGES as is the Children & Youth Report.. MAKE SURE YOU INCLUDE BOTH PAGES IN YOUR ENVELOPE!

DELEGATE STRENGTH REPORT

The Delegate Strength Report will not be generated until May 30, 2025. Keep an eye on your inboxes and the website (at the previously mentioned page). For the report we will be using for convention.

DELEGATE REGISTRATION

In your year-end packets there is a delegate registration form the clearly is labeled in big red font

"DO NOT MAIL THIS FORM! BRING IT WITH YOU TO CONVENTION REGISTRATION "

Yet I have received a couple in the report submissions, one even had a check. Bring this form with you to Convention with a check or cash to pay for your delegates. If you forget the form, there will be some at the registration table for you to complete.

SQUADRON INFORMATION REPORTS (SIRs)

As of this writing, we have still not received all of the Squadron Officer Reports. These reports need to be completed and submitted as soon as your squadron has completed elections. This report is **VITAL**. This report allows Department to assign appropriate permissions for your squadron to process membership and allows creation of the Detachment Directory. As a reminder, per Article X Section 13 of the Detachment Constitution:

"All officers of Squadrons, except the Squadron Adjutant and the Squadron Judge Advocate, shall be elected and certified to the Department Adjutant and Detachment Adjutant, **not more than ninety (90) days**, nor less than ten **(10) days** prior to the Annual Detachment Convention "

This means that your Squadron Elections should be completed by JUNE 2, 2025. GET YOUR FORMS IN TODAY.

DISTRICT OFFICER REPORTS (DORs)

District Constitutional Conferences (DCCs) should be wrapping up. Not all Districts have sent in their reports yet.

Per Article IX section 4 of the Detachment Constitution:

"\..there shall be held in each District a District Constitutional Conference not more than sixty Page | 9 (60) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the Detachment Convention"

This means that your DCCS should be completed by JUNE 2, 2025. GET YOUR FORMS IN TODAY.

As our Detachment Convention approaches, I wanted to take a moment to remind everyone of a few items. When writing checks for your donations to the various Charities, PLEASE make the check PAYABLE to the Charity.

For instance, say you have a donation for the Detachment Commander Rocky's charity, Operation Comfort Warriors. Make the check payable to Operation Comfort Warriors. Please make sure your Squadron number is on all checks as well. This way we can be certain of what Squadron gets credit for the donation.

For registration, please make the checks payable to the Department of Florida. Delegate fee's are \$5.00 per Delegate. Please remember to register your At-Large votes if your Squadron has any. If they are not registered, then they do not count for your Squadron. They must also be present on the Convention floor to count as well.

Some of our Charities that we work with are, Florida Special Olympics, Operation Comfort Warriors, Project Vet Relief, Child Well Being Foundation (The former CWF), Florida Children & Youth Fund, Fisher Houses, COTA, and the Veterans & Children Foundation. These are just to name a few.

If you notice, I did not list the National Emergency Fund, or NEF. At the past NEC meeting in Indianapolis the first weekend in May, it was announced that Sons of The American Legion are no longer eligible to receive money from the Fund. This comes after years of being included in receiving funds to help after a natural disaster. Apparently after some tornado damage in Kentucky, Son's members applied for assistance and were denied. Someone at National Headquarters looked at the original Charter that formed the Foundation and it stated for Legion members only to receive financial assistance. Please note that I am not trying to tell you not to donate to the NEF, I just wanted to make sure the members know if they apply, they will be denied.

On Expense reporting, other than being reimbursed for mileage without a receipt, all other reimbursements must have a receipt attached. Please be responsible for your meals as well. Your expense account is for your travel and not buying steak and lobster dinners for you and friends. One final item, NO ACOHOL on your receipts as well.

The National Convention is in our own backyard this year. In August we will all gather in Tampa for the Convention. The Detachment will be selling Pins and Coins and will need some Volunteers to help with this. Expenses for National Convention are not included in your 2025 – 2026 budget. There is a separate Delegate reimbursement for National Convention Delegates. All Delegates will have their registration paid by the Detachment, and each will receive \$300.00. This is based on the Detachment having 53 votes, including one At-large for PNC Roberts. More discussion will be held on the National Convention during the Detachment Convention.

As in the past, you can mail or email your receipts to me for approval. You do not have to send both. I hope everyone has safe travels during your year. Any questions, I am only an email or phone call away.

The Sons of The American Legion met for their semi-annual National Executive Committee Spring Meetings at the Sheraton Indianapolis City Center Hotel. The Florida delegation consisted of National Assistant Adjutant Ed Sheubrooks making his last NEC appearance after almost 30 years of service to our National Organization. Our Alternate National Executive Committeeman and Convention Committee Liaison Gerard Sambets and myself who has been appointed as NEC Lead Liaison to Internal Affairs Commission and the subcommittee on Resolutions

After we fly in and check in to our rooms we have a get together to discuss who is going to Commission & Committee meetings we are not a part of. Our Detachment Leadership Team had some questions, and our Assistant Adjutant Jennings and I worked up a presentation instead of just asking questions they received a hard copy of the questions.

The 1st & 2nd questions dealt with Squadron Data Reports. We presented the questionnaire to National Adjutant Wright, National Liaison Mook, Internal Affairs Commission Chairman Hill, and Membership and Squadron Activities Committee Chairman Verstreate. The 1st question was concerning a fillable, printable, & saveable in 2027. Answer was Not At This Time. 2nd question concerned posting a SDR that is electronic or in a portal. Not At This Time.

While we did get answers we wanted but stimulated thought and our concerns.

3rd Question was addressed to Member Training and Development Committee Chairman Cotton concerning online SAL Training. Answer: The Training Modules have been prepared and are being reviewed by The American Legion Internal Affairs Commission, unfortunately No Time Frame was Available for release and there are other training and online training in the pipeline.

4th Question was addressed Public Media & Communication Commission Chairman Chaplin & National Staff and TAL Advisory Chairman Mayne, Concerning our new website. The 2 websites one has since been taken down and the new website is currently working and being worked on and improved.

5th Question addressed to the subcommittee on Resolutions Chairman Fox. The Resolutions are no longer on our website. That was an oversight and has been brought to our TAL/SAL HQs I.T. staff by our Liaison. The past Resolutions are still being kept & housed by National Assistant Adjutant Thorton.

Our National Organization was extremely impressed with The Detachment of Florida with their way of communicating these important Sons of The American Legion problems. A big thanks goes out to NAA Ed, ANEC Gerard CDR Rocky and especially a big shout out to John Jennings who prepared the questions.

This all took place Friday evening and Saturday morning before we went into session. At 1PM on Saturday our National Commander Joseph Navarrete convened The Sons of The American Legion National Executive Committee Spring Meeting. We immediately begin the Commission and Committee Reports. We received a hand out from the Sons of The American Legion Commanders Advisory Committee. This was a first, with a summary on the cover page listed within the handout assessment strategies, data gathered, analysis conducted, commentary and conclusions reached.

Some of the highlights are future SAL University have been temporarily postponed until further notice due to the upcoming TAL College revisions. MT&D has also been tasked with creating a new leadership training program.

The National Resolution process has been under review and revisions are being made.

Status of the monthly newsletter (Millenium) and the establishing The National CDRs & National Adjutants & SALCS Updates.

PNC Scacco & PNC Hall are working to identify National CDR candidates and assist in coaching them and NVC candidates. Membership Training videos are in production.

Some of the pending items are The outline of Authorization is being finalized and this document is pending with national staff final review & editing. Reestablishing a fully functional website. Restablishing cooperation with the Child Well Being Foundation Board to get at least one grant submitted by the SAL excepted. Working with TAL Media & Communications to improve the SAL Brand. Establish a SAL National Security Commission. Work to establish a Paid Up For Life and Multi Year Membership.

Next year 2026 is the 250th Anniversary of The United States of America. The American Legion and The Sons of The American Legion are encouraging The SAL Detachments and SAL Squadrons to take an active part in the celebration. More information will be forthcoming.

 - 2) The letter must be on Squadron or Post letterhead and include the date that the Squadron or Post made the endorsement and that the membership approved said endorsement.
 - 3) This letter should contain information explaining why the individual should be considered for the office he is seeking and a narrative of positions held to show his leadership potential.
- 2) Endorsements will only be accepted for the elected Detachment Officers, District Commanders as follows:
 - Detachment Commander, Detachment Vice Commanders, National Executive Committeeman, National Executive Committeeman Alternate, Detachment Historian, Detachment Chaplain, Detachment Sergeant-At-Arms and the District Commanders

Endorsement letters must be submitted, in writing, to the Detachment Adjutant as follows with the required signatures (in the format listed above).

- Endorsement letters can be sent via the US Postal Service to the Detachment Adjutant Christian M Rapp at 215 Greenwood Avenue, Lehigh Acres, FL 33936.
- 2) Endorsement letters can be scanned and sent by e-mail to the Detachment at ad-jutant@floridasons.org. Scanned documents are required to be in an Adobe Portable Document Format (.pdf) and must have all of the original signatures as required and be of good quality.
